



**William Penn House and The Mosaic Initiative  
Beyond Treatment: HIV-Prevention Leadership Program  
Summer, 2009**

William Penn House and The Mosaic Initiative are partnering for an education and training program called “Beyond Treatment: HIV-Prevention Leadership.” William Penn House is a Quaker program and retreat center located on Capitol Hill in Washington, DC. The Mosaic Initiative is an HIV-prevention and education organization based in Wheaton, IL that operates without borders and boundaries. They share a commitment to empowering youth and young adults to engage in activism and advocacy for peace and social justice. This 4-day workshop will combine direct service and training about HIV-testing and education, as well as meetings with policy makers, government officials, and advocates that focus on both local and international issues. We will also spend time looking at the historical, cultural and institutional factors that thwart local, national and global efforts to stop the spread of HIV. The goal is to support leadership development for college students with a passion to respond to HIV/AIDS so that these future leaders can raise awareness to the importance of HIV-testing as a vital component in the fight against AIDS. The workshop will be held in Washington, DC, and will look at HIV through the lens of this city – from the neighborhoods impacted by HIV to the global policies that flow through Washington affecting people throughout the world.

There are no costs for this program (lodging, meals and training). Participants are only responsible for getting to Washington, DC. People interested in participating should fill out this application by April 1. Applicants will be notified by April 15. In addition, participants will be asked to commit to planning a campus activity related to World AIDS Day (December 1, 2009) for their campus that promotes awareness and testing. We will work closely on brainstorming and networking on these projects.

If you are interested, please fill out the attached application. In addition, please send one letter of recommendation from someone who can speak about your commitment to social justice.

Applicants will be selected based on passion and vision for the future as much as for previous experience.
